but carrying his big axe, ostensibly because it was too large to pack, but also as a subtle warning to strangers: Don't get too close to my Wife and her Child! How many times Our Lady must have looked at him with shining eyes that gratefully declared: "My hero!

St. Joseph's heroic virtues are not limited to dramatic moments. In routine everyday life, parents can look to his example of cheerful self-effacing sacrifice. Young couples will find in him a splendid model of the strength that comes from chaste love. Children can count on him to help them in their troubles big and small, just as he did for the Christ Child. Everyone who suffers misunderstanding, hardship, separation, in fact any trial whatsoever, can know they have a helper in Heaven who knows, understands, and will act.


Sunday & Saturday 7:30 am Weekdays 7:00 am
