Advent Reflections to Prepare for Ohristmas

Offer each day in honor of an aspect of the Divine Infancy, and gently repeat an aspiration throughout the day.

December 16 The Incarnation: "Behold I come to do thy will, O God." Hebrews 10:7 ~ May Thy will, not mine be done!

<u>December 17</u> The Visitation: Jesus, hidden in the womb of His holy Mother, sanctifies St. John the Baptist in the womb of St. Elizabeth. ~ Jesus, beginning Thy work as Redeemer in the womb of Mary, have mercy on us!

<u>December 18</u> The First Beats of the Sacred Heart: Reflect on the infinite love of Jesus for His Father, and also for you!~Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, make my heart like unto Thine!

<u>December 10</u> The Complete Dependence of Jesus upon Mary: May Our Lady form us also into the likeness of Christ. ~ Jesus, nourished by the substance and blood of Thy Most Holy Mother, I adore Thee!

<u>December 20</u> The Joy He gives to His Mother by His first felt Movements: When we are sad, remembering Mary's joy can lift our spirits. ~ Jesus, everlasting delight of Heaven, leaping from Eternity into time, be our Joy!

<u>December 21</u> The Patience of the Infant Jesus: Reflect on the burning desire of Jesus to redeem us, and yet He will wait 33 more years before culminating His mission on the Cross! ~ Jesus, most patient, have mercy on us!

December 22 The Helplessness of Christ in the womb: Offer Him your own powerlessness. ~ Jesus, I trust in Thee!

<u>December 23</u> The Journey to Bethlehem: "He came unto His own, and His own received Him not." John 1:11 ~ Come to me, my Jesus, there is room in my heart for Thee!

<u>December 24</u> The Nativity: Allow nothing today to cause you to doubt God's infinite love for you. ~ Jesus, King of Love, I place my trust in Thy merciful goodness!

You can continue this practice through the 12 Days of Christmas, until the traditional date of Epiphany, January 6th

<u>December 25:</u> The Adoration of Mary and Joseph ~ Sweet Heart of Mary, be my salvation! Teach me to adore Thy Son.

December 26: The Adoration of the Angels ~ Jesus, Joy of the Angels, have mercy on us!

December 27: The Adoration of the Shepherds ~ Jesus, Good Shepherd, keep us safe in Thee!

December 28: The first shedding of the Precious Blood at the Circumcision ~ Blood of Christ, save me!

<u>December 29</u>: He is given the Holy Name of Jesus ~ Jesus, be Thou Jesus my Savior, now and at the hour of my death!

<u>December 30:</u> The Presentation ~ Jesus, offering Thyself to the Heavenly Father, have mercy on us!

<u>January 1: The Adoration of the Magi</u> ~ My God, I believe, I trust, I adore, and I love Thee!

January 2: The Flight into Egypt ~ Help us, St. Joseph, in our earthly strife, ever to lead a pure and blameless life!

<u>January 3: The Slaughter of the Holy Innocents</u> ~ Through the sign of the Cross, deliver us, O our God, from our enemies!

<u>January 4: His First Steps</u> ~ Heart of Jesus, burning with love for us, set our hearts on fire with love of Thee!

<u>January 5: His First Words</u> ~ Speak, Lord, Thy servant is listening!

<u>January 6: The Holy Family at Nazareth</u> ~ Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, I love You! Save souls!
